*Every booking is a high-stakes
decision.*

Based on almost no information.

"This guest is verified"...

...usually means an email address
checked at signup.

Hotels have a front desk.

You have an automated check-in
and a cleaner who arrives after the
guest is long gone.

10-15% of bookings carry risk factors platforms don't catch.

With 200 bookings a year = that's up to 30 bookings with warning signs you never saw.

So what does a warning sign look like?

- Disposable contact details.
- Booking patterns that don't add up.
- Pushback before arrival.
- Profile inconsistencies.

Instinct without a process to act on isn't enough.

Professional screening can:

- verify contacts
- check watchlists
- read biometric ID
- make background checks

Good screening reduces risk.
